Recently Approved Programs

GreenGain is an energy efficiency program for small manufacturers. The program will be overseen by CT Green Bank and administered by the Connecticut Sustainable Business Council (CTSBC). It will provide training, mentoring, outreach, and a voucher program to help manufacturers find solutions to their most pressing problems.





Inclusive Manufacturing Internship Pilot is a unique internship program for people with disabilities, who are among the most underemployed group in the nation, yet, frequently the most reliable.
